Topic: Subject and Predicate

Go through the above video and after that try to solve the given exercise:

Every sentence has a subject and a predicate.

I. The **Subject** denotes the person or thing that performs the action mentioned in the sentence.

Study the example given below.

- **Mukesh** is writing a story.

Who performs the action (writing) here? **Mukesh**. So, **Mukesh** is the subject.

II. The **Predicate** tells us something about the subject.

Generally speaking, the predicate consists of all the words that are not a part of the subject. The verb (a word denoting action) is the most important word in the predicate.

The following part in the given example is predicate.

- Mukesh **is writing a story**.
